A Handwritten Family Record



This information on the family of Nathan and Sarah (Crampton) Lamb comes from an undated, handwritten record currently in the possession of Terry R. McNelley, descendant of Nathan and Sarah's tenth and last child, Sarah Amelia. The document consists of several small, obviously old, pages hand-sewn together into a "booklet." The dates of birth of all ten children of Nathan and Sarah, as well as a number of marriages and deaths are given. Some of the more intimate details suggest that the information came from a family bible. The author of the booklet is unknown. It appears that two or three individuals entered information in the booklet and that the entries were made at different times. Or perhaps the record was made by the same individual but at various points in life.

Nathan Lamb (1808-1898) was the son of Joseph Lamb (a Revolutionary War soldier who was born in Rhode Island and settled in Vermont) and his second wife, Clora Willard. Nathan was born on July 15, 1808 in Randolph, VT, and married Sarah Ann Crampton in Franklin County, Vermont on August 29, 1836. They had the following children: Allen C. (1838), Clora Welthy (1839), Clora (1840), Andrew Joseph (1842), Nathan Jr. (1844), Orris Pier (1845), David Crampton (1847), Mary Eliza (1849), Willard Amos (1853), and Sarah Amelia (1856).

The family of Nathan and Sarah Lamb is listed in the U.S. Census of 1850 for Sheldon, Franklin County, Vermont. By 1853, the family had moved to Ohio where Willard Amos and Sarah Amelia were born.

With respect to the notation on the first page of the booklet (shown below), the only individuals named Dorcas known in the family were Dorcas Marcy, Joseph Lamb's first wife who died in 1803, and Dorcas Marcy, the oldest daughter of Joseph and Marcy.






